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Assessment Approaches

Start with a standard—describe what your student should know and be able to do.

Choose a way for the student to demonstrate that competence. Here is a list of different ways to assess. It is best to use more than one kind of assessment so that students have a fair chance to demonstrate competence and also so that teachers can figure out what students' strengths and needs are.

a) Students solve problems applying skills and concepts	
b) Students write explanation of steps to solve problems	
c) Students write questions (and answers)	
d) Students read text independently, write summary	
e) Students write explanation of why they choose an answer (multiple	
choice)	
f) Students write independently	
g) Students edit written material, correcting errors	
h)Students list and define important vocabulary, use in sentences	
i) Students write explanation of the topic	
j) Students write letter to person in a history/story	
k) Students write translation—restate in own words

You can use a rubric with some of these, and you also can use a very simple system:
