Dear Mayor Daley

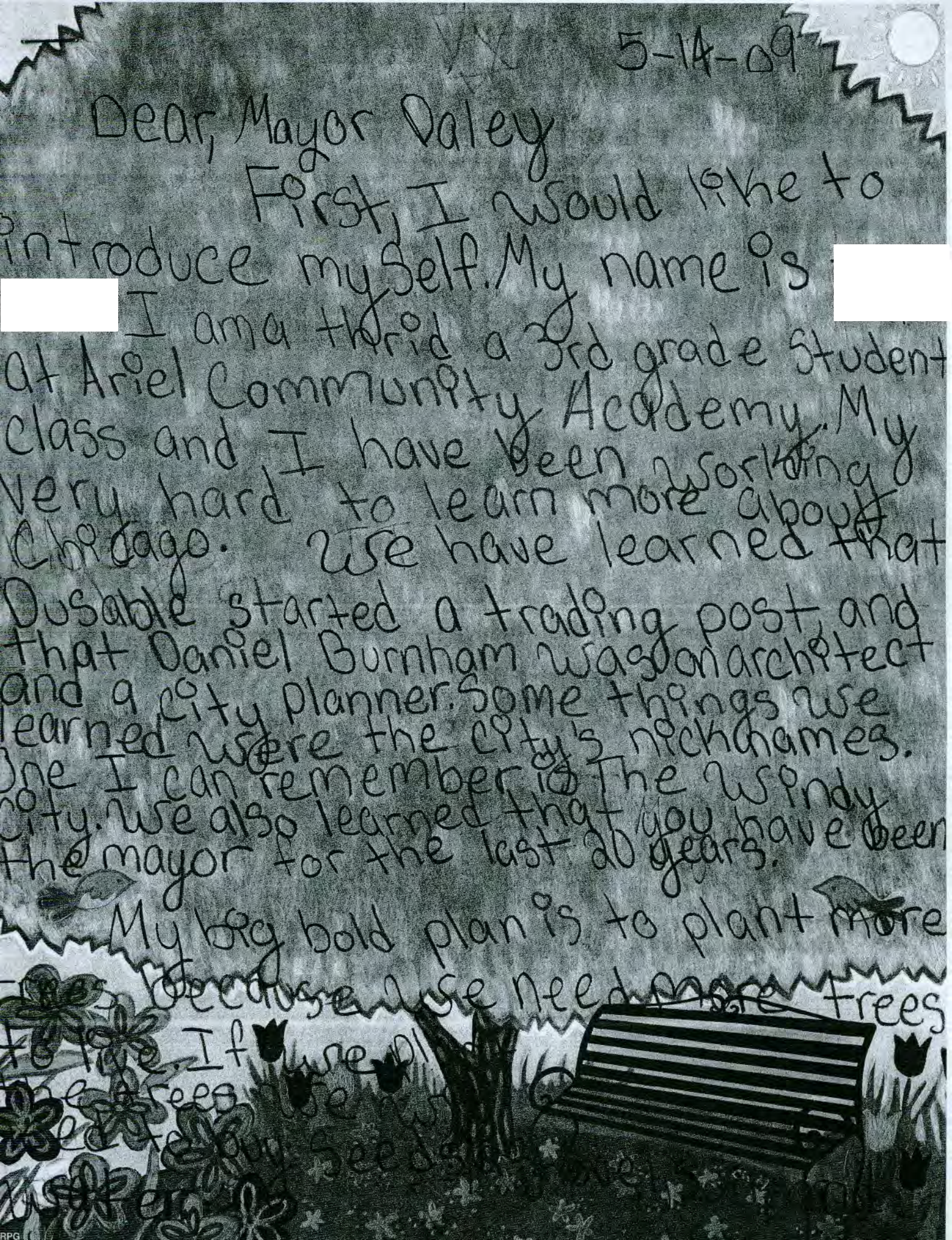
First, I would like to introduce myself. My name is [redacted]
