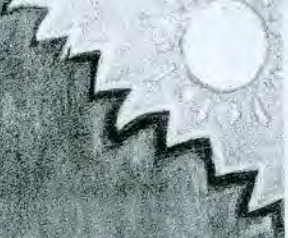

Dear Mayor Daley,


