


READ THOUGHTFULLY, then THINK MORE--INFER!

The following diagram includes standards-based questions. They are good questions to ask about any story—even stories on TV! Choose a story. Read it and talk about answers to these questions. Use information from the story to support your inferences.

- Illustrate the story. Draw pictures showing important events.

- Choose music that the characters would like.

- Tell about what might have happened before the story started.
