ILS 1A: I can make up vocabulary questions.

When you make up a multiple choice question, you think five times. First you think about the question. Then you identify the correct answer. Then you make up three answers that could be correct but are not the best answer.

Make up multiple choice vocabulary questions for another student. You could ask them to choose the best antonym, the best synonym, the sentence in which it is used most correctly. You can make this more challenging by asking the other student to rank the answers, not just to choose the best one. Here is a format you can use.
