

How a Writer Supports a Claim

CCSSR8—evaluate evidence for a claim; CCSSR5: identify writer's techniques. Note to teachers: This guide may be useful as a preparation to evaluate two or three sources' presentation of a claim.

A claim is a point of view about something. For example, <u>Chicago</u> is a city is a statement of fact. **It's not an idea**. Here is a claim about Chicago: **Chicago is the best city in the world**.

Writers support a claim with evidence. Readers evaluate the evidence.
