• <b>Illustrate</b> the topic.	• Make a <b>glossary</b> .	• <b>Write a children’s book</b> .
• <b>Write</b> a <b>summary</b> .	• <b>Write</b> and exchange <b>questions—then answer</b>	• Based on what you know and what you learned, <b>write about the topic</b> .
• Create or complete a “ <b>web</b> ” <b>diagram</b> .	• Create or complete a <b>chart</b> .	• Organize information for a <b>debate</b> on this topic.
• Create or complete a <b>timeline</b> .	• Create or complete a <b>map</b> .	• <b>Write</b> a <b>letter</b> from someone in this situation.
• Create or complete a <b>graph</b> .	• Each student <b>writes</b> one page in a <b>chapter about the topic</b> .	• <b>Revise a textbook chapter to add illustrations and captions</b>
• <b>Write</b> a <b>booklet</b> about the topic.	• <b>Write</b> a <b>diary</b> as if you were a person in the situation.	• Make a <b>top ten fact list</b> .
• Make an <b>exhibit</b> .	• Draw a <b>sketch</b> .	• Make an <b>alphabet chart</b> about this topic.
• <b>Write/draw</b> what’s next.	• <b>Outline</b> the topic	• <b>Write</b> a <b>guide</b> .
• <b>Present a lesson</b> to the class	• <b>Write</b> a <b>poem</b> about the topic.	• Use <b>pictures or symbols</b> to communicate the topic without words.
