EXHIBIT ORGANIZER

Make Your Own Technology Exhibit or Book

An explanatory book is a kind of exhibit, and an encyclopedia is the most visible kind of exhibit. However, encyclopedias include so much information that often it's hard to see that they really exhibit our collective knowledge. Your students can take an encyclopedia apart and organize an exhibit about one theme or subject. They also can create their own encyclopedia.

Here are the topics listed in the Random House Encyclopedia for different kinds of transportation and the development of transportation. Each of these developments represents applied technology. You can use this as your outline or choose just one topic for your book or exhibit. Your students can research each topic (using cooperative learning, assign one topic to two or three students) and then organize a display or book. In fact, you could have a Technology Fair that develops students' basic research and writing skills as well as critical and creative thinking.
