MAPPING YOUR BLOCK

A Geography Kit from the DePaul Center for Urban Education

The lay-out on the next page is a starting point for a personal map of the block on which your family lives.

Here is what you need to set up this homework project:

Paper -- Crayons -- Time -- Imagination

We have provided four outlines for you to use to help a young child describe in pictures the places on the block. There are three important outcomes for this project: 1) your child will use words to describe a real place; 2) your child will get to know the neighborhood better; 3) your child will get ready to learn map skills in school.

- Step 1: Write the name of your street on Outline 1.
- Step 2: Explain that a map is a way of showing where places are.
- Step 3: Start with your own home. Use outline 2 to show it.

Have your child draw pictures in each section of that outline.

(Remember that the answer to "who works here" is "everyone" – every person in your family does jobs. Your child should draw a picture to show them doing those jobs.)

- Step 4: Write words to label the people your child draws.
- Step 5: Write your home address on the page, too.
- Step 6: One at a time, help your child complete each of the other outlines.
- Step 7: When you finish the five outlines, fill in the map on Outline 1.
- Step 8: Start a display for this map.

If possible, put the outline sheets on a wall on which you use a strip of paper to show the street.

Step 9: Keep going--you can add more places, you can go to the next block.
